****ABSENCES CORRECTION**:** If your child is ill, please call **391-3113** prior to 9:00 a.m. each day your child is absent. For your convenience, an answering machine will take your message during all non-school hours.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE EXPLORATION CLASSES: The Mississippi Bend Area Education Agency is sponsoring Spanish classes for students in 1st through 6th grades at the Scott Community College Campus in Bettendorf. BACKPACK SAFETY:

- ✓ Make sure your child's backpack weighs no more than 5 to 10 percent of his or her body weight to prevent your child from bending forward in an attempt to support the weight on the back rather than on the shoulders, by the straps.
- ✓ When packing the backpack, make sure pointy or bulky objects are packed away from the area resting on the child's back. An uneven surface rubbing against your child's back could cause painful blisters.
- ✓ Tell your child to use both shoulder straps, not just one. A backpack slung over one shoulder disproportionately shifts all of the weight to one side, and can cause neck spasms, muscle spasms and low back pain.
- ✓ Padded shoulder straps are very important as they are more comfortable than non-padded straps and help prevent the straps from digging into your child's shoulders.
- ✓ Shoulder straps should be adjustable so the backpack can adjust to fit your child's body. Too loose shoulder straps can cause the backpack to dangle uncomfortably, causing misalignment and pain.

PETS AT SCHOOL: Please refrain from bringing pets to school as students are dropped off or picked up. FROM THE NURSE'S DESK: Welcome back! I hope everyone is ready for a happy and healthy start to a new school year. I would like to remind parents of all kindergarteners and any new students from another state that Iowa requires dental exams; extra forms are available in my office if you need one. All kindergarten students also need to show proof of lead screening. I will send home reminder notes soon with kindergarteners who have not completed their immunization boosters.

I have been seeing many students in my office the past few days complaining of irritating bug bites. Please remember to apply a bug repellent to your child before sending them out to play in the early evening hours.

I would also like to take a moment to remind everyone the importance of good hand washing. It is our number one defense for the common cold and many other illnesses. Please work with your child at home and teach them how to wash hands properly as well as when to wash them. If your child is sick with a fever, bad cough, body aches and/or sore throat, **PLEASE KEEP THEM HOME**. Anyone with a fever of 100 F or greater needs to stay home until the fever is reduced without the aid of fever reducing medicine for 24 hours. Also keep your child home if they are vomiting or have diarrhea. Your child should be able to eat and tolerate solid food before returning to school. PARKING/DROP-OFF & PICK-UP: Remember the front parking lot is reserved for school bus drop off from 8:30-9:00 a.m. and pick up from 3:00-3:40 p.m. and **NO PARENT VEHICLES ARE ALLOWED IN** at these times. **ALSO REMEMBER** when using the Kussatz Ln. back turnaround, children must enter and exit their ride from the sidewalk in the right lane only; the left lane is for **SLOWLY** passing the other cars in the turnaround to exit and students are prohibited from exiting vehicles from the left lane. Please pull forward all the way to the end of the curve (not just at the sidewalk that leads to the playground). Should you feel the need to watch your child enter the building, please pull into a designated parking space and either step out of your vehicle to watch or walk them up to the building. **TO KEEP EVERYONE SAFE, PLEASE BE PATIENT AND WAIT YOUR TURN.**

Parents dropping off late arriving or picking up early departing students must come to the 53rd Street lot as all building exits are locked from the outside after the beginning of school. Please do not to park in the yellow curb areas but find an empty space in the lot. An adult must check early departing or late arriving students in or out at the office.

Finally, there is ***No Parking on the Lutheran Home property.***
