General Information:

Extra-curricular teams include Color Guard, Drill, Raider and Marksmanship.

Color Guard - Cadet Team provide ceremonial flags at various events

Drill – Cadet Team compete in drill and marching competitions

Raider – Adventure Training, 10K road march, Rope Bridge, obstacle course

Marksmanship – Cadet Team compete in air pellet rifle marksmanship events
