

Board Update
State Accreditation Report
Update on Actions, Week of July 9, 2018

Phase 1 of the Accreditation Action Plan has been completed. The June 30, 2018 corrective actions have been met. These actions include the following:

- A total of 860 families were sent letters of students where there was no evidence that their child's minutes of instruction were reduced from Spring 2017 to Fall 2017, but may include an insufficient Prior Written Notice, offering to hold an IEP meeting if requested. These letters were mailed on Thursday, June 28, 2018. As of today, July 12, 2018, a total of five (5) parents have requested an IEP meeting.
- The Special Education Department and AEA reviewed a total of 138 Functional Behavior Assessments (FBAs) and Behavior Intervention Plans (BIPs) completed by either DCSD or AEA 9 personnel. The group will continue to review additional FBAs and BIPs at a later date. The purpose of the review was to determine if FBAs and BIPs were technically adequate.
- Building tours have been completed and corrective action completed on rooms noted to have deficiencies.
- Procedures have been developed for ensuring that Early Childhood IEP meetings are attended by both district and AEA required members.

Phase 2 of the Accreditation Action Plan continues.

- The special education department continues to hold IEP meetings for students who had 45 minutes of special education services in the fall of 2017. Between June 25, 2018 and July 11, 2018, a total of 142 IEP meetings have been held. Of the 142 IEP meetings, 51 (36%) have resulted in the need for compensatory education. The remaining 64% have resulted in no findings of non-compliance. It has also been reported by IEP teams that a significant number of anecdotal comments from parents who have attended these meetings have been very positive in nature and have expressed pleasure and support of the special education services provided by DCSD.
- FBAs and BIPs will continue to be reviewed to determine the technical adequacy on July 17, 2018.
- A meeting has been scheduled for July 24, 2018 to begin the data dig regarding disproportionality.
